TOURNAMENT HOST:

Each team will be assigned a tournament host. The host name and contact information will be given to each team as they qualify. Your host team will be composed of members from the local youth softball organization.

PLAYING RULES:

All playing rules and regulations for the tournament will be in accordance with the 2016 NCAA rules.

CONDUCT:

Coaches are asked to have complete control of their players both on and off the field. Any report of damages by hotel management, restaurant management, or any city personnel will be dealt with by the tournament committee. We require all coaches to sign a coach's code of conduct prior to all tournaments. Form is on page 17.

PLAYER PASSES:

Lanyards will be distributed to rostered players, coaches, trainers and bus drivers only. These lanyards must be worn in order to attend all events.

MISSISSIPPI HEAT:

For people who are not accustomed to the humidity in The South, it can be very dangerous. Please encourage all players to prepare for the heat by drinking plenty of fluids before making the trip and while they are here. This is a very serious situation and proper planning will help avoid any emergencies.

CONCESSIONS:

MEDICAL:

Mississippi Sports Medicine will be on site for any player injuries. Sports medicine will furnish supplies for injured players as needed. Those wishing to receive additional treatment should supply their own equipment.

FORMAT: Double Elimination.

UNIFORMS: All players must compete in accordance with NCAA rules.

LINE-UP FORMS:

Tournament officials will provide line-up forms for each team. An official line-up form must be submitted to the score keeper at least fifteen minutes prior to the scheduled game time, for each game.

GAME TIMES:

Please follow the times listed on the official tournament bracket. Game time is forfeit time. Teams should be prepared to start a game immediately after the preceding game is completed.

PREGAME WARMUP:

No infield practice will be permitted. No soft toss into fences. Warm-up is allowed in designated areas only. Teams may warm-up on the outfield grass. Teams wishing to schedule a practice time may call Adam Wade at (601) 924-6082.

PRESS BOX:

Under no circumstances is anyone allowed in the press box area, other than score keeper and authorized personnel, unless prior approval has been granted.

DUGOUTS:

Players, coaches, and a bat person are the only individuals allowed in the dugout. Home team and visiting team will be determined by a coin toss when line-ups are turned in to the assistant tournament director. Teams should occupy the dugouts that designate home and visitor.

- Water coolers, cups and fans are supplied in each dugout throughout tournament.

LOCKER ROOMS: There will not be locker room accommodations at Traceway Park.

INCLEMENT WEATHER:

In the event of inclement weather, the game must be resumed at the exact point where it was suspended. It is the coach's responsibility to report to the fields for rain out information. If severe weather should occur and teams have to depart the field we have several ways to check play status: See Rain-Out Information on page 14.

▶ The complex has a Thor-guard system which detects lightning within a 12 mile radius. Please obey this system when lightning is in the area. See 'Park Rules' on page 23 on what to do. This system is for your protection.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WILL TEAM COOLERS BE ALLOWED IN THE PARK?

One team cooler will be allowed in dugouts. We will provide water and cups in the dugouts for teams. Please visit our concession stand for any food, drinks, and snacks during the tournament.

CAN WE SCHEDULE PRACTICE TIMES ON THE GAME FIELDS?

Those fields that will be played on during the tournament will not be available to schedule practices at any time and will remain closed until game time. However, we do have other fields available on site. If you would like to schedule a practice time please call Adam Wade at (601) 924-6082. We have several fields and batting cages that are available. Those teams utilizing fields without calling for a scheduled practice time will be asked to leave. All fields at Traceway Park are available by appointment only.



This code of conduct applies to all region, district and national events, contests and tournaments sponsored by the National Junior College Athletic Association. Violations of the code of conduct occurring during the regularly scheduled season events shall be referred to the respective conference or region Standards and Ethics Committee. The jurisdiction of the NJCAA Code of Conduct ends when colleges competing in such tournaments arrive back on their respective campuses.

Code of Conduct

- A. Participants shall recognize the responsibility for proper conduct at any national tournament, event or contest sponsored by the NJCAA or its member colleges.
- B. Coaches shall recognize and assume responsibility for the actions of themselves and the team members. Each coach who has participants competing in the event shall be responsible for informing each participant about the Code of Conduct.

Behavior

Coaches, players, and institutional personnel must remember that they are representatives of an institution of higher learning, its faculty, and administration and student body. As such they are expected to conduct themselves in a manner which would reflect credit on their team, institution, region and the NJCAA. Student-athletes, coaches and institutional personnel who are participating in NJCAA events are subject to all NJCAA rules, regulations and penalties as stated in the NJCAA Handbook as well as local, state and federal laws.

Inappropriate and unacceptable behavior by coaches, players or institutional personnel will not be tolerated before, during, or after contests; at the hotel or in public while representing their college. This Code of Conduct does not replace Article XVIII of the NJCAA handbook. Unacceptable forms of behavior include but are not limited to:

1. fighting
2. taunting
3. inappropriate celebration
4. disrespectful attitude toward opponents, officials, tournament administrators
5. use of profane and vulgar language
6. use of tobacco, drugs and/or alcohol
7. disrespectful attitude toward host hotel personnel
8. unlawful activities

Derogatory comments

Coaches, athletes or institutional personnel shall not make derogatory public comments regarding administration of a tournament or officiating of contests during post-game interviews or at other times; to print or broadcast media, in news releases or institutionally produced news releases or under any conditions when their comments may become public. The head coach shall be fully responsible for assuring that no public comments are made by the coaching staff, student-athletes or institutional personnel about officiating, fighting or other incidents which occur during contests.

A coach shall not address or permit anyone in the team area to address uncomplimentary remarks to any game official during the progress of a contest or engage in conduct which might incite student-athletes or spectators against officials.

Reporting

Violations of the Code of Conduct may be reported to the Executive Director of the NJCAA or his designee.

Procedures and Penalties

Immediate Action

Where immediate action is needed to alleviate or control a situation, the Executive Director or designee shall have the authority to act at his/her sole discretion. Examples of events which would require immediate action include but are not limited to the following:

- Allegation of serious misconduct requiring immediate suspension of institutional personnel or student-athletes from competition.
- Instances where the Executive Director or designee deems it necessary to protect the equity and integrity of the competition.
- Protection of the event's officiating program, particularly in an instance where public comments by an institutional representative may affect competition.
- Any instance or circumstance which might affect the safety of officials, participants or spectators attending the event.

Penalties-Immediate Action

The Executive Director or designee may issue any penalty that he/she believes appropriate to any student-athlete or institutional personnel who has violated the regulations pertaining to conduct when the Executive Director or designee concludes that immediate action is required. The actions of the Executive Director or designee shall be final and binding but shall be reported to the Standards and Ethics Committee within one week.

Timely Action

In cases where immediate action is not required but where sanctions are warranted, the Executive Director or designee may issue the following penalties:

Reprimand: The Executive Director or NJCAA Standards and Ethics Committee may issue a letter of reprimand to the coach, player or institutional personnel who violates the regulations pertaining to conduct. Copies of the letter of reprimand will be sent to the Director of Athletics and the President of the institution.

Probation, suspension and other penalties: If the misconduct is serious enough, the Executive Director or designee may issue other penalties which may include but are not limited to probation, suspension or disqualification of the coach, player or institutional personnel from participating in one or more contests.





HOME RUN DERBY RULES/ENTRY FORM

2016 NJCAA Division II Softball National Championship

Home Run Derby

Pitching Distance: minimum 20ft, maximum 43ft (screen is available)

1. First Round Format will be as follows:
 - a. Competitors will be split into Group A and Group B. Group A will compete on Field 2 and Group B will compete on Field 3. The competitors will be randomly pre-drawn to determine which Group.
 - b. For the First Round, each competitor will get two live practice swings and then 10 official swings.
 - i. Pitches that are not swung at will not count toward the total.*
 - ii. The number of home runs after 10 official swings will be noted.
 - iii. The top two finishers from each Group will advance to the final round on Field 3.
 - iv. If any ties exist for the top two spots, the following tiebreaker will be used:
 1. Each competitor that is tied will get 5 swings (no practice). The competitor with the most home runs after their swings will get the spot in the final. If competitors are still tied, each competitor will have a sudden-death "swingoff" where they will get 1 swing each. (Ex: Player 1 and 2 are still tied – Player 1 hits a home run on her swing. If Player 2 hits a home run on her swing, it continues. If Player 2 doesn't hit a home run, Player 1 advances to the final)
2. Final Round Format will be as follows:
 - a. Final Round will be held on Field 3.
 - b. Each competitor will get 1 practice swing and 5 official swings.*
 - c. The top finisher will be the Home Run Derby Champion.
 - i. If a tie exists for first place, all tied competitors will have a sudden-death "swingoff" as outlined above to determine the champion.

***Total of 48 balls (plus 6 charity balls) will be allowed for each round. Essentially you have 54 pitches allowed per round.**


